




FLIPPING THE EXERCISE

INTERCULTURAL MODEL





A NEW MODEL AT DICKINSON

- Moving to a workshop model instead of one general and one program specific pre-departure
- Health and Safety nitty gritty and application process will be short workshops online.
- Three in person mandatory workshops that are interactive and focused on intercultural agility with a smaller number of students
- Optional workshops either given in person or online: Students of color, LGBTQ+, Finances, and will develop additional
- Students can start taking workshops in first year and eventually questions on the application will reflect their work in these workshops



THE THREE INTERCULTURAL WORKSHOPS

- The Plan: 3 intercultural agility workshops through different lenses
 - Health, Safety and Wellness
 - Living and Learning in a New Culture
 - Navigating Identity and Relationships
- Students will be tasked with completing some type of "homework" before each session. They can choose from a variety of activities and will be encouraged to engage with both domestic and international students who are different from them in some way.
